Recipes Furnished By Department Specialists To Clubs The office in charge of club work in the Northern and Western States furnishes the following recipes for the home canning of fruit: 1. Soft fruits such as strawberries, blueberries, dewberries, sweet cherries, blackberries, peaches, apricots etc. Can the same day fruit is picked. Grade and rinse the fruit by pouring water over it. Wash in cold water. Pack immediately in glass jars or tin cans. Add boiling hot syrup of 18 per cent density (thin). Place rubber and top in place. Partially tighten. (Cap and tip tin cans).
