HAS GRIP THAT HOLDS ROGERS TRIUMPHANT

AND SO HIS NAME LEAD ALL THE REST AT DIRECT PRIMARY

W. B. ROGERS HANDSOMELY NOMINATED UNDER COMPETITION AT REPUBLICAN CAUCUS AS CANDIDATE FOR REPRESENTATIVE, INCREASING IN POPULARITY YEARLY.

The chief topic of discussion in political circles about town this week has been and now is the unexpected success which greeted Selected man Willard B. Rogers in his quest after the nomination as republican representative in the state legislature for the town of Manchester. He received the largest number of votes of any candidate in the primary, namely 866, and naturally felt very much elated because of this undoubted evidence of the loyalty of his friends and of their desire to confer further honors upon him.

When it became known about the town hall Tuesday evening that Mr. Rogers was a sure winner the large number of his enthusiastic admirers who thronged the lower hall gave vent to their feelings of glee and exultation by thunderous shouts of

of their joy trying to embrace voters against him, to belittle and to create prejudice against him. In these endeavors they have been magnificently unsuccessful. Mr. Rogers has gone on from these "times" of his leading to his knighting and increasing his number of friends year after year. In 1914 Mr. Rogers received as a candidate for selectman in the direct primary 324 votes. In 1915 for the same office he received 669 and this year he received 866. If the "old lines" continue their good work with the same brand of success as they have in the past, in so far as Mr. Rogers is concerned, his vote is destined to increase by leaps and bounds.

For a candidate in competition to receive 866 votes out of a total of 1,300 cast is certainly very commendatory and Mr. Rogers has every reason to feel proud of the achievement and grateful for the enthusiastic support he received at the hands of his friends. It does not often come to a young man who is arrayed in distinct opposition to what are known as the "old line republicans" to make such a showing as a vote-gatherer as that ascribed to Mr. Rogers at the caucus. The young man of the republican party rallied to his standard and stood faithfully by their desire to see his nomination made an assured fact. His friends have the political grip that holds.

DIRECT PRIMARY VOTES IN DETAIL

The direct primary for the nomination of representatives, selectman, assessor, collector of taxes, registrar of voters, constable, auditor, school visitor, judge of probate and justices of the peace took place at the town hall Tuesday evening. The weather was clear, crisp, fall weather prevailed throughout the entire day. Automobiles in ample numbers were requisitioned to bring the voters to the polls. The voting through the early part of the day was not at all spirited, but kept up with constancy and increasing interest and intensity as the day advanced. The polls opened at 7 o'clock in the forenoon and continued at eight at night. Five machines were used to record the republican votes and one for the democratic. Announcement was made of the result of the balloting at twenty minutes after the closing of the polls.
