political party nor did we make an appeal in behalf of any political candidate.

"If the members of the school board will look over the ballot they will find on those ballots a woman's suffrage party nor will they find any where else in the political scheme of the state a woman's suffrage party. Our association has no connection whatever with any partisan political organization and the members in it are members of all political parties so that it cannot under any stretch of the imagination come under the heads of the group excluded from the use of the school house. It is splitting hairs in too fine a way.

"The school building belongs to the public and I think the time has come when the public shall have the right to use the school building for all forms of educational purposes.

"There was certainly nothing that I said in my address while in Manchester of a partisan political character. Neither did we assume to be organized as a partisan political organization. I think we must lay emphasis on the fact that we are absolutely non-partisan as an organization and that members of our body belong to all of the different political parties.

"Consequently we can, in no sense be called a political party organization."
