HOME ECONOMICS COLUMN

Perhaps there is nothing which most of us enjoy occasionally better than good cake. The materials which go to make up a cake are expensive and unless care and time be taken in combining and baking a cake, it would be better not to attempt it.

The two varieties of cakes are: cup cake, that which is made with shortening, and sponge cake, which is made without shortening. A sponge cake should be slightly moist, very tender, filled with very minute bubbles of uniform size and pale yellow in color.

All parties will then want our vote. Roman Children's Christmas Custom

MOST popular on Christmas day in Rome is the Church of the Holy Child, which the children of Rome, for at least one week in the year, regard as their very own. In England, on St. Stephen's day, boys used to masquerade in preference to times as bishops and canons in cathedral choirs. Here in Rome in the twentieth century boys and girls pretend to be preachers. In the Ara Coeli, among the fabled columns which have come down to us from pagan days, is reared a pulpit for the children in sight of the "precept," or reproduction of the cave of Bethlehem, arranged in a distant chapel. Mounting the stairs in quiet succession, the little ones recite, with surprising self-possession and perfectly natural pose, short sermons learned by heart to the delight of proud parents and admiring friends. Occasionally two children will appear in the pulpit of one and sustain a dialogue which displays their mastery of the catechism. Arguments are illustrated by frequent pointings to the jeweled Bambino, or figure of the infant Saviour, far away in the "precept," where the diamonds on the little image glitter in the light of a hundred lamps. Great is the crowd and boyish the play of the children, who on this day blow tin trumpets and joy quiet games among the shrub pillars, supervised by the Brothers of St. Francis, who for six centuries or so have ministered in this historic sanctuary.
