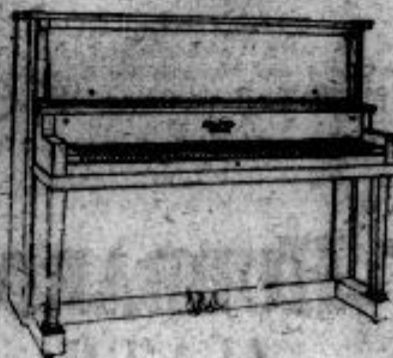

OPEN AIR SCHOOL

APPEAL FOR HELP

CONTRIBUTIONS ASKED IN ORDER TO CONTINUE GOOD WORK FOR WEAK CHILDREN

Under Law Cannot Be Done By Taxation. Generous and Forward Looking People Are Asked for Donations. High Cost of Living Being Felt.

The Open Air School, which was started in January 1911, has for the last six years been building up the health of delicate children. This work has been done persistently but quietly so that many people do not realize how indispensable a part of the school system it has become. It is a very happy solution of a difficult problem. It is almost impossible for a busy housewife with other children to keep a delicate child in the fresh air. If he is weak from the after effects of some contagious disease, or has a bad heart, or is very excitable and nervous it will not do for him to play too hard. If turned loose he is apt to come home exhausted with wet feet and so catch a bad cold. Nor can a child be told to sit still outdoors without special clothing or occupation to satisfy him. The open air school provides warm bags for the children to sit in, sheepskin shoes to keep their feet warm, blankets for the rest hour and enough work to interest the children and prevent them from falling behind their grades. A good hot dinner is served at noon for which the children pay 10c a day. At the present prices that does not cover the cost of the food; the deficit and the other expenses for clothing, etc. have been borne by the Educational Club. This club is now issuing a general appeal in the hope that the value of the school is now so well recognized that this community will help pay for the food and clothing which the school district is not authorized by charter to pay for from taxation. This work is constructive and preventive: while no tubercular children are received because of the danger to the other children, many delicate youngsters have been prevented from becoming tubercular. This is a piece of preparedness which appeals to every generous heart; it is preparing the rising generation to meet life with the enthusiasm of health instead of the despair of disease. Whether the country goes to war or not it will need above all strong courageous boys and girls for the future. Let us give them their chance.

STATEMENT BY SUPT. VERPLANCK

The Open Air School is doing a useful work in our school system. It cares each year for about thirty pupils whose powers of resistance are low and who need good food, rest and well regulated hours for work and recreation. To many pupils, the school gives just the impulse toward good health which is needed in order that they may enjoy and profit by their subsequent school work and become strong and healthy citizens.

GOING TO HOSPITAL TO BE TREATED

CLASS INITIATION OF MOOSE SUNDAY

Big Round Up of Candidates At Armory Opera House

The open charter period of the South End Lodge of Moose came to a close at an enthusiastic meeting held in Foresters hall last Wednesday evening, at which time twenty-two names were proposed for membership. There were fifteen candidates ready to be voted upon and these were elected. There are several other applications in the works and it is expected that a class of forty candidates will be initiated next Sunday afternoon.

The initiation will take place at the Armory opera house, the Foresters hall being too small to accommodate the large number of Moose who will attend the exercises. This hearing is called for the purpose of getting the views of property owners on the change in curb line which the selectmen contemplate on the east side of Main street. At a hearing last year the curb line was agreed upon, but now the selectmen believe a change in the curb line is necessary and in order to protect the interests of the town the hearing will be held.

It will no doubt attract a number of the property owners on the east side of Main street, and those who are opposed to the construction of a walk in front of their properties will have an opportunity to be heard. The change in the curb line is very slight and will not materially affect any of the property owners.
