OVER THERE The Thrill and the Hell of the Trenches, Described by an American Boy.

A FEW days after the bombing raid, which ended so disastrously for us, our battalion was relieved from duty on the front line, and the tip we got was that we were to go down to the big show then taking place on the Somme. Our relief was a division of Australians. You see, the sector which we had held in Belgium was a sort of preparatory school for the regular fighting over in France. It wasn't long before we got into what you might call the big league contest, but in the meanwhile we had a little rest from battling Fritz and the opportunity to observe some things which seem to me to be worth telling about. Those of you who are experienced members of the stirring details of war, such as shooting and being shot at and bombing and bayoneting, need only skip a little of this. We had an entirely satisfactory amount of smoke and excitement later.

As soon as our relief battalion had been put into position, we were ordered to get away from the strain of holding a front trench, and there were other advantages. For instance, the officers told our master dog to casualties, had not come through battalion headquarters, and therefore we had in our platoon six or three men at night and morning and only sixteen men.
