USE BOTTLES TO SAVE CANS

Fruit juices for use later in jelly making can be sterilized and bottled without sugar and made into jellies at the housewife's convenience.

From the unaged sterilized juices of currants, apples, crabapples, and grapes, kept from 9 to 18 months, the Bureau of Chemist, United States Department of Agriculture, recently made jellies of excellent texture, flavor and color.

To put up unaged fruit juices for jelly making proceed exactly as if jelly were to be made at the time. Cook the fruits until they are soft and strain out the juice through a muslin bag.

ANOTHER METHOD

Press the juices from strawberries, blackberries, raspberries, grapes, apples or other fruits as oranges and lemons. Strain and heat to just below boiling point; put into bottles which have been cleaned and sterilized.
