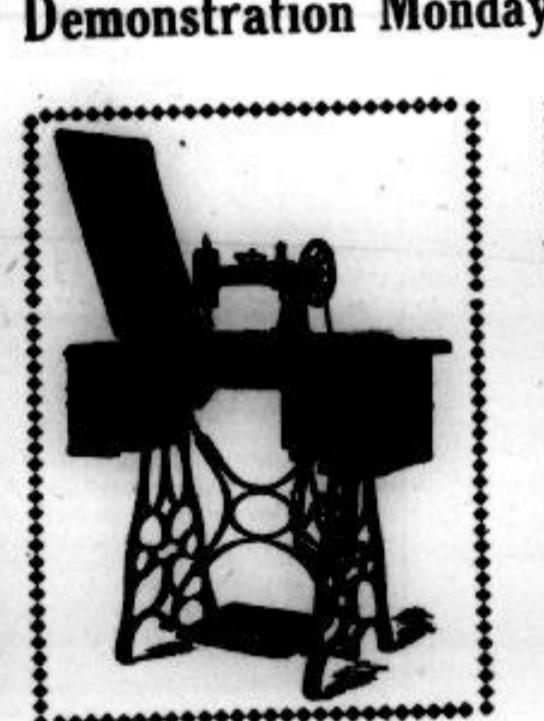

NEW HAMPSHIRE J. OF P. COURT PUTTING ON ALL TRAFFIC WILL BEAR OR PERHAPS MORE

Extenuating Circumstances Not Permitted To Temper Quality of Justice in Case of Howell Cheney—"He Who Laughs Last Laughs Best."

Howell Cheney of South Manchester has lately had an experience of the voracity and rapacity of the average New Hampshire justice of the peace in any courtroom that will militate against a repeal of the law. New Hampshire justices were rolling up money finding fault with automobiles for exceeding the speed laws, whether they exceeded or not. "Stay a week and appeal, if you prefer," was their agreeable phrase for anyone who could not pay a fine.

Mr. Cheney's experience, however, came in through the game laws, but the justice game was the same. His family spent the summer at Lake Sunapee and when he recently went up there he found that one of his children had been arrested for catching three pickers under a tree. The legal limit is 12 inches and these measured 11 3/4, 11 and 10 1/2 inches. When taken before the justice, Mr. Cheney argued that, as the violation was unintentional and by young people it seemed fair to pass only one count, but the justice remarked that he had looked up Cheney's financial standing and found he could pay the whole, so he was going to make him and fined him \$20.

He had a cash only two \$20 checks on the Phoenix National Bank of this city for money drawn by Cheney Brothers. These the justice took and paid him back \$18 in change. Mr. Cheney came home, realizing how he had been skinned, but a few days later luck came the two checks, which he had endorsed, the bank where they were taken had declined to accept his endorsement, claiming that he should have signed them.

See the restrictive justice of the situation! The fine of \$20 has not been paid and the \$18 that the justice took from him on the check is back in Mr. Cheney's possession. The \$100 in the Phoenix National Bank is unobtainable, but it is not likely that justice is. The justice now is on Governor Holcomb for extradition. It happens that Governor Holcomb was once in an automobile party that was victimized by a New Hampshire justice. He knows what sort of cattle they are.

Mr. Cheney was in New Haven yesterday at the meeting of the Yale corporation and was introduced to the president of the corporation by a New York lawyer who was just as not possible to learn from him what he is going to do. It would be the fair thing if he let the justice spare for his misadventure and let the justice get caught—Conrad Tuesday

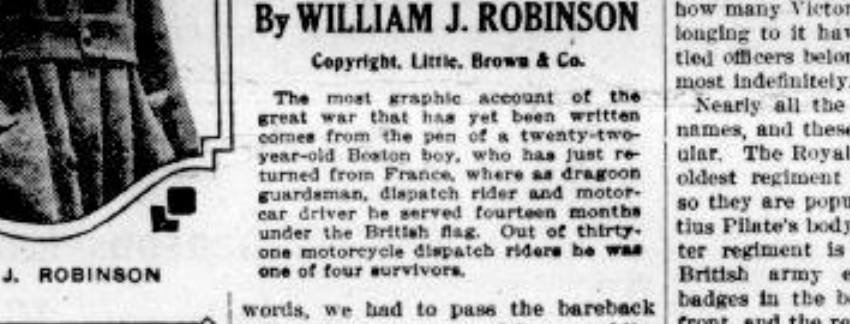

THE great graphic account of the great war that has just been written comes from the pen of a twenty-two-year-old student who has just returned from France, where as a dragon cavalryman, scout, rider and motor-cyclist he served fourteen months under the fiercest conditions of the war.
