For the former, the surface of the wound is first thoroughly cleaned with sterilized cotton swaps moistened with a 4.8 solution of glucose in water. This forms an isctonic saccharine "serum." It is then covered with dressing scaked in the solution, which is secured in the usual manner with sterile wool

For the dry dressing powdered glucose is dusted over the surface of the wound. In some few cases this is painful, although the moist dressings occasion no pain. The dressings are renewed every day for infected wounds and thoroughly elemased at each dressing. 


