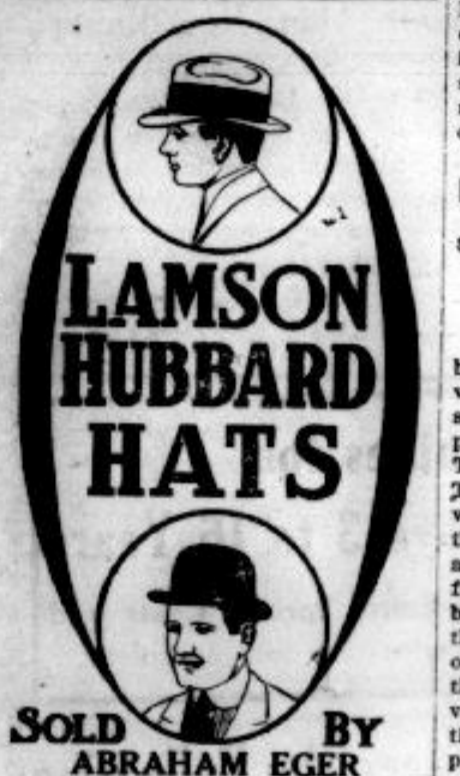

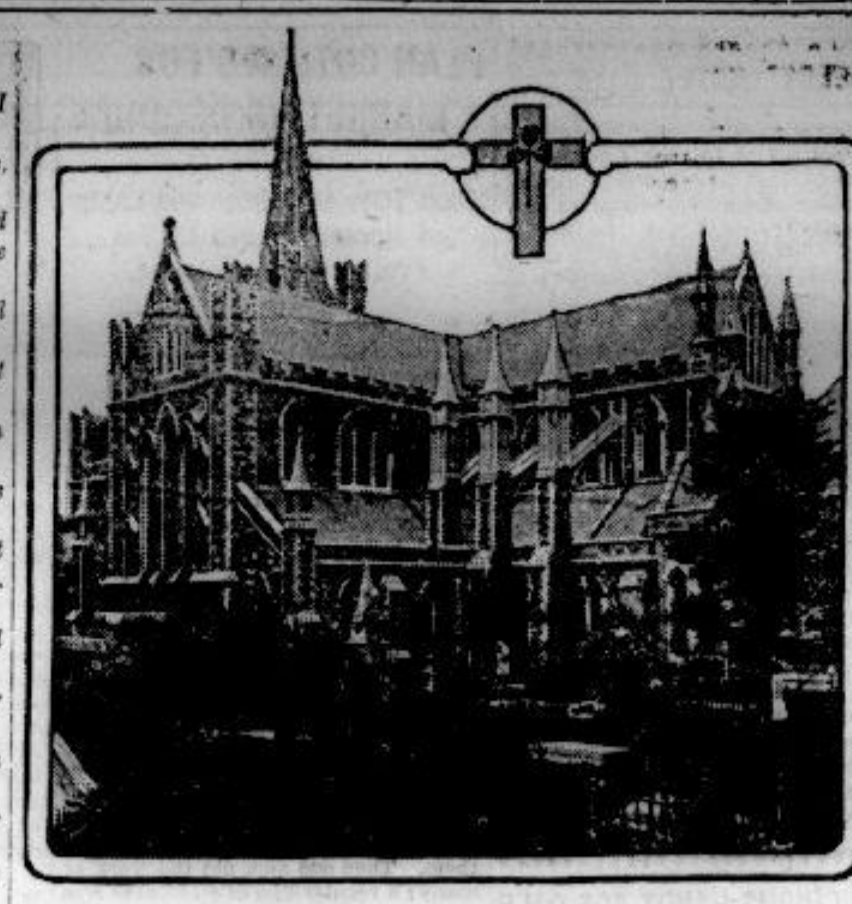


St. Patrick's Day

FEDERAL INCOME TAX IN BRIEF

Penalties for Income Dodgers Are Severe—Get Your Return in if You Are Liable.

April 1, 1918, is the final day allowed under the federal income tax law for the filing of federal income tax returns.

Several penalties are provided for those who neglect or evade the tax. For failure or refusal to return there is a penalty not exceeding \$2,000.

Dividends are not subject to normal tax, but must be reported and included in the return.

Gifts and legacies are not included in the return. The gift tax for 1917 is designed to reach the person who gives.

Under the law the head of the family is not exempt from the tax. The amount of the tax is based on the gross income.

What ever has been said at one time or another about the Red Cross is not new.

RED CROSS TO START MAY 20. All Chapters to Participate in Big Nation-Wide Campaign Lasting One Week.

The second \$100,000,000 War Fund campaign of the American Red Cross will begin on May 20 and continue through that date, according to an announcement made by G. M. Dahl, chairman of the War Fund Committee for the Atlantic Division of the Red Cross.

The Big Red Cross campaign was originally set for May 15, but on account of possible interference with the Liberty Loan drive it was decided that the later date would more effectively serve the interest of the Red Cross and the Liberty Loan Committee.

The public immediately responded to the appeal, subscribing more than \$100,000,000. Interest added to the contributions brought the total fund to \$105,000,000.

At the time of its first war fund campaign the membership of the Red Cross was a little more than 500,000. Today, as a result of the membership drive during the week preceding Christmas, the Red Cross has approximately 2,000,000 members.

RED CROSS TO START MAY 20. All Chapters to Participate in Big Nation-Wide Campaign Lasting One Week.

The second \$100,000,000 War Fund campaign of the American Red Cross will begin on May 20 and continue through that date, according to an announcement made by G. M. Dahl, chairman of the War Fund Committee for the Atlantic Division of the Red Cross.

The Big Red Cross campaign was originally set for May 15, but on account of possible interference with the Liberty Loan drive it was decided that the later date would more effectively serve the interest of the Red Cross and the Liberty Loan Committee.

The public immediately responded to the appeal, subscribing more than \$100,000,000. Interest added to the contributions brought the total fund to \$105,000,000.

At the time of its first war fund campaign the membership of the Red Cross was a little more than 500,000. Today, as a result of the membership drive during the week preceding Christmas, the Red Cross has approximately 2,000,000 members.
