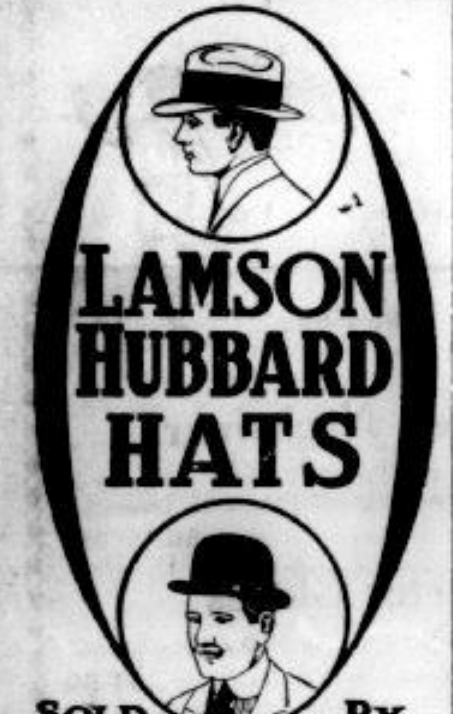

FERTILE GARDEN MOST DESIRABLE

Dead Vines, Cabbage Stalks and Refuse Should Be Gathered Up and Burned

PLAN FOR PROPER DRAINAGE

Use Tile Drains Spaced Every 10 to 20 Feet, or by Open Ditches—If Soil is Heavy, Apply Lime

Prepare to do your part in increasing America's food supply by raising your own vegetables in your home garden.

Plan your garden on paper. Map out your campaign. You will profit through time, labor, and money saved.

Plan your home garden in advance. Make a diagram of the available space; allot the ground to the vegetables you want to grow.

Provide Good Drainage. If the area in the garden is not well drained this should be corrected by using the drains spaced every 10 to 20 feet.

Plan for Home Needs. A typical plan of this character is shown in the illustration.



Lighten Heavy Soil. If the soil is at all heavy it is advisable to make an application of air-slaked lime as soon as the plowing is done.

Produce satisfactory crops of vegetables the soil must be kept in a high state of fertility.

Plan for a Small Garden. In this plan all the vegetables named are planted in rows across from the inside lateral rows of strawberries.

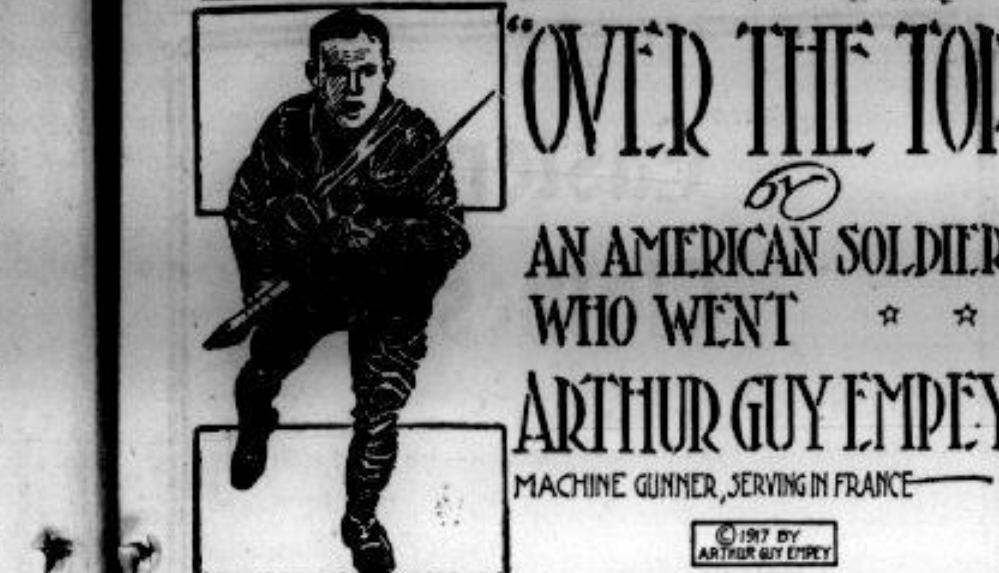
