HAVING NIGHT AT CAMP DEVENS

Visitors Tell How War Camp Community Service Makes Life Pleasant.

SOLDIERS ENJOY THEIR CLUB.

Letters from the boys in training camps tell, from time to time, of what the War Camp Community Service is doing for them and what its kindly care for them means in strange surroundings far from home.

But the letters home do not always picture just how the boys are acquiring this club spirit. Sometimes it is only really understood by the home folks when they see its result with their own eyes.

The information bureau at the North Station, in Boston, established by the War Camp Community Service, was opened last January for the accompaniment of Camp Devens men.

Most of the men of the 79th Division had left Camp, as the time when we were there was shortly after the end of July.

For some reason a negro soldier took a dislike to the speaker. He was some ten or twelve years older than any one else in the world.

The letter to which the writer referred as an enclosure read as follows: "Dear Mr. Barr: Just returned from Camp Devens, where I was the guest of the wonderful Club for Enlisted Men on Mr. Crowley's invitation.

When one considers the tremendous number of negroes in service (the total in the United States is 300,000) and that these men are leaving homes and families all over the United States.

Nowhere is the finer community spirit which will result from the war work more being done all over the country for the negroes.

"The spirit with which our soldiers leave America, like the efficiency on the battle fronts of Europe will be vitally affected by the character of the service training camp."

"I never enjoyed my visit anywhere more than—not even as much as at the country for the negroes."

Preservation of Vegetables by Salting

In this method of preservation, the vegetables are packed with enough salt to prevent fermentation or the growth of yeasts or molds.

Wash the vegetables, drain off the water, and weigh. To each pound of vegetables, use one-fourth pound of salt.
