MEAT INCREASE AT TIME NEEDED

Producers Responded Nobly When Demand Was Shown to Them.

CATTLE AND HOG FIGURES.

Government Justified in Park Policy Which Now Provides Chief Supply to Meet Three Billion Pound Fat Shortage.

In line with the general plan of conservation formulated by the U. S. Food Administration immediately following the entrance of the United States into the war the contribution made by the meat producers of this country to the war program is of particular significance.

According to reports of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, there was a steady increase in the production of 12,441,000 hogs, these figures compared to January 1 last.

Since January 1 official information indicates an increase in hogs of not less than eight per cent and not more than fifteen per cent compared with one year ago, with an increase in average weight.

Following the request of the Food Administration for an increase in hog production for the fall of 1915 the spring of 1916 the increase may yield about 1,000,000 more hogs than were available last year.

The dressed hog products during the three months ending September 30, 1917, amounted to 903,172,000 pounds, while for the same months of 1918 the production was 1,275,580,000 pounds, an increase of over 374,000,000 pounds for the quarter.

During the same period in 1917 inspected slaughter of dressed beef amounted to 1,263,000,000 pounds against 1,454,000,000 pounds for the three months period ending September 30, 1918.

We must increase our meat shipments, especially our pork products, to meet the added demands of the millions liberated from German oppression. And at the same time we must look forward to the rehabilitation of the European meat market.
