MADDERN; ESCAPE IN AUTOMOBILE

Robbers Here For Purpose of Stealing Raw Silk From Cheney Brothers-- Attempt Frustrated But Officer is Killed in Performance of Duty-- News Shocks Community.

William F. Madden, a patrolman in the employ of Cheney Brothers and doing slight duty about their silk mills, was murdered last night at 11:30 o'clock. Officers Madden and Clifton F. Macomber discovered five men prowling around Cheney Brothers large raw silk stock house on Elm terrace. The men were there evidently for the purpose of stealing raw silk. While attempting to arrest the strangers on suspicion a struggle ensued in which Officer Madden was shot to death. After the shooting the murderers fled in their automobile to Hartford where the driver was arrested and placed in the Hartford police station.

Officer Macomber dropped off the car but Officer Madden remained. Officer Macomber said the car was traveling so fast when he got off he rolled over and over and finally reached the gutter. He heard the shooting going on and saw Officer Madden fall from the automobile. Officer Macomber fired as the men in the fast moving automobile were leaving. He was wounded in the chest and arm. He was taken to the hospital and is now recovering.

MRS. MADDERN PROSTRATED Mrs. Madden was not informed of the murder until about four o'clock this morning, when her brother-in-law, Maurice J. Madden and Daniel F. Ryan, Robert K. Carney, Thomas J. Quinn, Mrs. Maurice J. Madden and Mrs. William Edgar went to the Madden home to break the news. Mrs. Madden was prostrated by the news and she immediately collapsed. She was taken to the hospital and is now recovering.

WIPED FROM EARTH Only Dust Remains of Front City of Babylon.

When a person makes a toll call specifying that conversation is desired with a given person, and the connection is established and conversation held, the "station to station" rate applies.

"Report Charge" This charge is to cover compensation for the operating work performed. In connection with all toll calls other than those made on a "station to station" basis where the connection is established but conversation is not held, because of any reason beyond the control of the telephone company a "report charge" is made equivalent to about one-fourth of the "station to station" day rate.

"Appointment Rate" When a person, in placing a toll call, appoints a definite specified time at which he will talk and the conversation is held at a specified time, the "appointment rate" applies.

"Messenger Call Rates" When a call is made on a "person to person" basis and a messenger is required to secure attendance of the designated person at the nearest available telephone at the designated point, the messenger call rate applies.
