Rev. Oliver T. Magnell Assigned To St. Josephs Church

Announcement was made by Bishop John J. Nilen of Hartford last week through the Catholic Transcript that Rev. Oliver T. Magnell, pastor of the Sacred Heart church and Catholic chaplain at the state prison, had been assigned to be pastor of St. Josephs church in Bristol. Just when Father Magnell will assume his duties in Bristol is not known definitely. Rev. Francis J. Kuster has been the acting pastor of the Bristol church.

Mr. Magnell was born in South Manchester October 14, 1870, a son of Oliver Magnell and was the oldest of six children, the others being Maria C. and Charles J. of South Manchester, James Magnell of Bristol, Mass. and Alfred E. Magnell of New Britain and Leo C. deceased.

Mr. Magnell was graduated from St. Charles college, Elliptic City, Mo. in 1891 and was assigned to St. Johns cathedral in Brighton, Mass. on December 23, 1894. He was ordained by Archbishop Williams in Holy Cross cathedral, Boston.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS SOLDIERS TO ATTEND GALA SOCIAL FUNCTION HERE EASTER MONDAY EVENING

For eighteen years Campbell Council Knights of Columbus has made it an annual practice to give an elaborate ball in Cheney hall. The one exception was last year when on account of the war the ball was not given. Now the war is over the council is to resume its custom and the Knights of Columbus ball of 1919 is destined to sweep all records by the council for an event of this kind.

The date of the ball is April 21, which will be Easter Monday evening, the evening always selected by the council during the eighteen years referred to. As this means that the ball will be next Monday evening a large number of committeemen are actively at work completing arrangements. A meeting of the general ball committee will be held this evening.

Having a membership of two hundred, mostly young men, Campbell Council will be expected to heavily during the war, over one-third of its entire membership having entered the military and naval service. This will be the eighteenth annual ball of the council.

A wage reduction for employees of the Erie (Pa.) Railroad was announced. Employees receiving \$2.50 a day or more will be reduced 50 cents; between \$2 and \$2.50 to \$2; two-dollar laborers, \$1.75 to \$1.50 effective at once.

Joseph Kennedy, branch secretary of the Metal Miners' International Union No. 800, I. W. O., one of the organizations that declared a strike of miners in Butte on February 7, was taken into custody by United States immigration authorities.

Following the example of Chicago and Bloomington, the labor unions of Old Bridge, N. J., placed a ticket in the field for the April election. William B. Porter was nominated for mayor.

Leon Miel, general secretary of the Railroad Men's union on the Paris, Lyons and Metropolitan railway, who on January 25 ordered a general strike lasting one minute and affecting the whole system, was sentenced to one year in jail by a court martial at Bourges.

Wages of the sightless workmen at California State Industrial Home for the Deaf at Illinois were increased 20 per cent this year because of increased returns from the brown shoe of that institution. The shop connected with the home at Oakland, brought in \$40,714, Douglas Keith, the superintendent, reported.
