Red Men Elect

At the meeting of the Miancton tribal tribe of Red Men held at the hall Monday evening the following officers were elected for the ensuing term: John Hornum, sachem; Joseph Ferguson, Sr., senior sagamore; Goddard Kesh, Jr., junior sagamore; Charles Slover, prophet. "Long Talk" were given by Past Grand Sagamore William F. Pond of Hartford, one of the oldest Red Men in the state, and by Red Skins of the local tribe. The officers will be installed at a meeting to be held July 17. The new district deputy, John Woodard of Hartford, will be the installing officer.

SUSTAINS WOODHOUSE WONT PERMIT REJECTION

Judgment for the defendant was the verdict of the justice jury which last week heard the case of Antonio Lamezo against F. W. Woodhouse of Pine street.

When the case was called two weeks ago Judge H. O. Bowers who represented Mr. Woodhouse set up a special defense to the effect that Mr. Woodhouse was in the army in France at the time when the six months notice to continue the lease for an additional five years was signed and did not suppose it was necessary for him to give the notice right on the day.

Judge Tuttle who represented Mr. Lamezo demurred to the counter-claim and set up in his defense that the lease was given to two parties, Mr. Woodhouse being but one of them and that the notice to continue the lease under the terms should be given by both parties, and not one, as was the case.

The case was continued until last week while Justice of the Peace F. R. Manning took the counter-claim under consideration. Justice Manning announced that the demurrer had been sustained. It was expected that at that time Judge Tuttle would ask for a direct verdict but he did not do so. He started to introduce evidence. At the conclusion of the evidence Judge Tuttle asked that a direct verdict be given for the plaintiff. This Justice Manning would not do and after the jury was out he brought in a verdict for the defendant. Notice of an appeal was given by the plaintiff.

WATERING TANK NOW HAS METER

The South Manchester Water Company has attached a water meter to the drinking fountain at South Main street and Hartford road. Heretofore water had been furnished free by the water company. The town has taken care of the water in the fountain. The town will now be called upon to pay for the water used.

The fountain has a bubbler through which persons may procure a drink. School boys take delight in breaking this bubbler off, and many times it is not convenient for human beings to get a drink of water there. Some persons have been seen dipping water up with their hands out of the big stone trough which contains water for horses. Although this is not a healthy way to drink from the fountain there are many who take the chance.

FORD CALLED "ANARCHIST"

Soldiers Testify That The Ford Co. Held Places Open For Them and Helped Families.

The Chicago Tribune in an editorial printed June 23, 1916, declared "Henry Ford An Anarchist." It followed this with the charge that Mr. Ford would not hold jobs open for the men in his employ who were called to the Mexican border, nor would he assist any of their dependents who might be in need.

Mr. Ford brought suit for libel against the Tribune for the sum of \$1,000,000 and the case, after many legal battles, was brought to trial in St. Clemens, Mich. In an editorial printed the Tribune has summoned a large number of witnesses from the Mexican border to testify to the fact that Ford held places open for them and helped their families.

WHAT CARNEY SAYS ABOUT REAL ESTATE

Robert E. Carney one of our local real estate men in discussing the real estate situation here makes the following comments:

"That South Manchester, like other places throughout the state is enjoying a real estate boom, is evident by the many houses being built in the past two weeks as compared with the same time last year. In the same period in 1918 there were but eight sales, while this year the sales number thirty-four. Not only were the sales made during the past two weeks more in number, but they are greater in value. The average mortgage for the two weeks this year was \$8,900 while the average mortgage for the number of sales was less than \$500, which indicates that there is more money now to be secured.

This man stated that he had paid for his license and had secured the necessary papers. He hoped the federal license would be the revenue office about keeping open after June 30th and the official told him that he had received no instructions ordering the revoking of any federal licenses and that the closing of the saloons would be the same as heretofore.
