BOARD OF SELECTMEN WORKING ON BUDGET MET FRIDAY AFTERNOON AND DISSECTED APPROPRIATIONS MADE LAST YEAR

Dr. Weldon Favors Using Almshouse for Isolation Hospital in Time of Need. Good Judgment Used in Expanding Funds. Interesting Deductions

ANOTHER BRICK BLOCK FOR MAIN STREET John Mammos proprietor of the South Manchester Kandy Kitchen in the Tinker building is planning the erection of a modern brick block on Main street north of the Salvation Army citadel. Mr. Mammos with John Pappas of Hartford recently bought two building lots on the Douglas tract from John F. Sullivan and Wilson Richardson and the new building is to be constructed on this site. The lot has a Main street frontage of forty feet and is bounded on the other three sides by a street.

At the special meeting of the board of selectmen Friday afternoon it was announced that the net town deficit for the year amounted to only \$4,044.83. This is gratifying to the town fathers who have labored untiringly in disposing the town's affairs, when it is considered that additional appropriations made since the tax rate for the fiscal year was fixed amount to \$7,300.

In other words if the additional appropriations had been made, the town's business would have been conducted on a budget of \$11,344.83, estimated when the outgoing year's budget was prepared. All of the present town fathers felt that in view of the fact that there have been increases in the salaries and wages of all town employees, together with a decided increase in the cost of all materials, this showing is creditable.

SEASON CLOSED FOR PLAYGROUNDS The Cottage street and West Side playgrounds closed for the season last Friday and Director Whiting has completed the attendance figures for the final week. During the closing week the attendance at the West Side playground averaged 192, while the Cottage street playground attendance averaged 348. At the Globe Hollow swimming pool the average attendance was 67 and at the Recreation swimming pool the average attendance was 88. The women's classes at the "Ree" swimming pool averaged 33 for the week, while the men's classes averaged 23. The West Side playground tennis courts drew an average attendance of 12 while the tennis courts at the High School averaged 5.

CHARITY AFFAIRS JUDICIOUSLY MANAGED In preparing estimates for the incoming year, the board took many abnormal conditions into consideration. The charity appropriation for the outgoing year was \$15,000, and because of the influenza epidemic and other conditions this appropriation was exceeded by \$1,329.50. There was no criticism of this amount, as all of the town officials recognized that the excess expenditure was inevitable. It was voted to recommend an appropriation of \$16,000 for charity for the incoming year.

USE ALMHOUSE FOR ISOLATION HOSPITAL In discussing this account, Dr. T. H. Weldon said that if he is on the board of selectmen next year and should be advised that influenza is epidemic in the town, he would be glad to remove them to a hospital to protect the community, he would favor converting part of the big almshouse into an isolation hospital. He recalled that the town paid \$1,180 to the Hartford Isolation hospital during the outgoing year and said that he is now ready to announce plans whereby the almshouse could be used for the other inmates and with a big saving to the town.

WOULD BE VOTERS ATTEND TO THIS REGISTRARS WANT YOU The Registrars of Voters will be in session at the Hall of Records next week Thursday from 9 a. m. to 3 p. m. in order to receive the applications of persons who desire to be made voters. No applications will be received after 5 p. m. on September 11. It will be well for all those who desire to come into the voting privilege to give heed to this warning.

HIGHWAY MONEY Following a long discussion of proposed highway work for the incoming year, the board recommended \$40,000 appropriation for general highway work, \$10,000 for street lighting and \$5,000 for sidewalk and curbing construction.

PARKS AND TREES For parks, tree spraying and tree doctoring an appropriation of \$1,000 will be recommended. This appropriation was the same as last year, and while there was an unexpended balance of \$728 it was felt that more money will be needed next year for the Center Springs which have been donated to the town for park purposes, will probably be improved next spring.

STREET LIGHTS The board will recommend an appropriation of \$10,000 for street lighting next year, this amount to include the special lights on Main street, in the Center park and at the north end. Of interest to the town will be the announcement that the first year of the contract for the White Way lights will have expired and the town will be confronted with a proposition to take over this bill. The first five years of this bill has been paid by the merchants and property owners at the rate of ten cents per year.

POLICE APPROPRIATIONS Evidently the board of police commissioners expect to extend the police service next year, as they recommended police appropriations of \$11,000 as against an appropriation during the expenditures in this department of \$9,381. The appropriation was exceeded by \$1,619. This would mean that the town would be required to pay for the cost of the police force.

SUM GOES OUT OF TOWN Although the exact figure has not been received, it is estimated that this town's share of improvements made on the Connecticut River will be \$10,000.

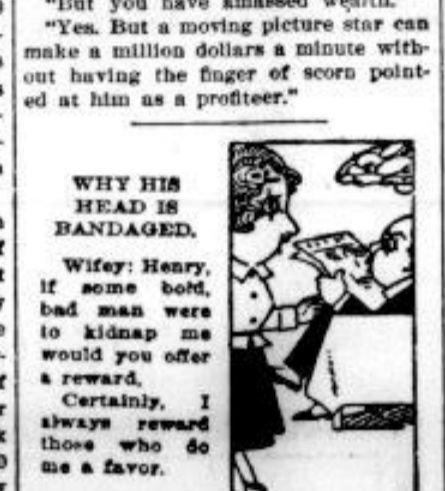

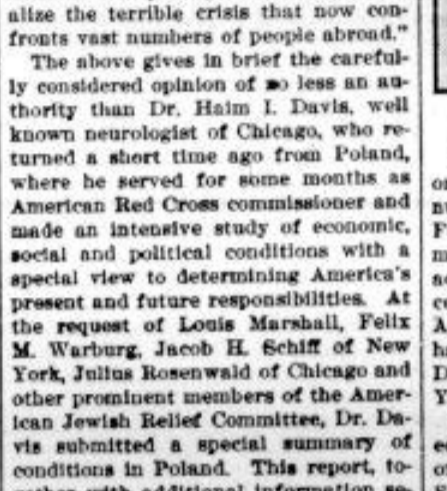

Words are utterly inadequate to describe the suffering from poverty, starvation, disease and other allied causes that is met on every hand. Literally hundreds of thousands of the unfortunate victims of circumstances are looking to America as their only hope, but it is a question if America has not heard so much of suffering in recent months that it has not been able to do anything more than a considered opinion of so vast an authority that Dr. Haim J. Davis, well known neurologist of Chicago, who returned to his native Poland where he served for some months as American Red Cross commissioner and made an intensive study of the conditions of the Polish people.

FIRST AID COURSE TO HELP PREVENT 'WASTAGE' OF LIFE Red Cross Plans Instruction for Industrial Establishments and Schools in America
