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HOME PROGRAM EMPHASIZED IN CALL FOR FUNDS
RED CROSS WILL OPEN CAMPAIGN ON NOV. 3
Membership Primary Purpose. \$15,000,000 Asked for as Means of Fulfilling War Obligations.

The enrollment of members for 1920 and the collection of \$15,000,000 to enable the organization to fulfill its war obligations at home and abroad are the objects of a nation-wide campaign to be conducted by the American Red Cross, beginning Monday, November 3, and continuing until Armistice Day, November 11. Local appeals will be made by chapters where necessary to secure funds for local purposes, according to the statement of Dr. Livingston Farrand, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Red Cross, in formally announcing the campaign.

During the war there were two annual Red Cross campaigns, the War Fund Drive in the late spring and the Christmas Roll Call for membership. The only campaign this year will be the one in November, and in succeeding years there will be only the annual Roll Call, in which the Red Cross will seek the reaffirmation of allegiance of the American people expressed in dollar memberships. The money so derived will be used for American and foreign purposes, and the approval is to be regarded as a mandate to carry on future programs.

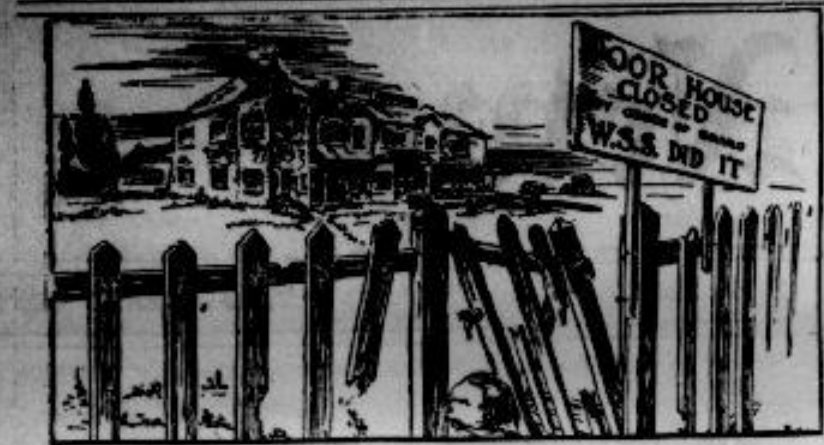
