ON CHARTER OAK ST. BRICK BUSINESS BLOCK TWO DWELLINGS
Two Stores Six Tenements, Wooden Buildings Contain Two Residences Each. About 130 Feet Square of Land in Purchase
Last Wednesday morning Cheney Brothers bought the remaining property on the south side of Charter Oak street belonging to the estate of late T. O'Gorman. The purchase includes the brick blocks for many years operated for saloon purposes, and also the two wooden buildings at the rear. These are double tenements in the brick building there are two tenement upstairs. There are two stores on the main floor. The property has a frontage on Charter Oak street of approximately 130 feet. It extends for the same distance to the north. It was in the possession of Mr. O'Gorman for many years. He constructed the brick building in later years. Peter N. Larson conducted a saloon business on the ground floor. Mr. Larson used one of the stores in the block for a saloon and the other for a party supply store. He bottled beers, also, and delivered same to residences on orders. The incoming national prohibition put all the saloons of the land out of business. War time prohibition placed the first check upon the saloon business. Mr. Larson never resumed selling after the war time restrictions he was effective. It has not been announced to what use Cheney Brothers will apply the brick business block. The transfer was made to Frank Cheney, Jr., representing Cheney Brothers.

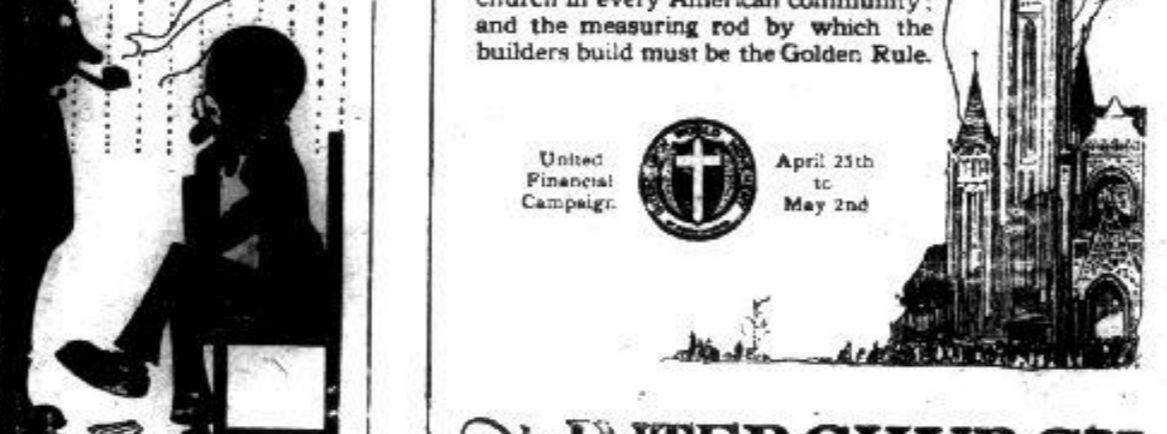

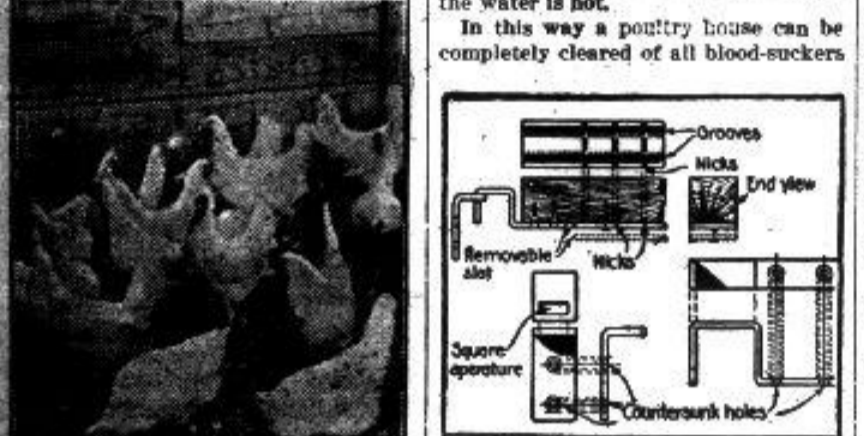

PULTRY

PULLETS MAKE BEST LAYERS

It is a well known fact that pullets make the best layers. They lay more eggs than hens and their eggs are of a larger size. They also live longer and are more profitable than hens. It is therefore recommended that farmers should keep a large number of pullets for their egg production.

Early hatched pullets, if properly grown, ought to begin laying in October or early November and continue to lay through the winter. Yearling pullets seldom begin laying until January 1 and older hens not until later. It is the November and December eggs that bring the high price. The laying breeds should begin laying when about five to six months old, general-purpose breeds at six to seven months, and the meat breeds at eight to nine months.

VARIETY OF FOOD FOR HENS

Fowls easily obtain different things necessary to make eggs and maintain body. Constantly feeding one or two grains only keeps the fowls to eat more than they ought to eat and makes their digestive systems work too hard trying to get all the different food elements in sufficient quantity out of this material. By feeding a variety of food the fowls are not obliged to consume so great an amount and they can more easily obtain the different things required to maintain the body and make eggs.

SIMPLE REMEDY FOR WORMS

Give Twenty Drops of Turpentine in Milk or Water and Mix in Mash for Morning Feed.

POULTRY KEPT AS SIDE LINE

Hardly any activity of modern farming which will pay better than Poultry. Property developed and fostered poultrying is one of the most profitable side lines in which most farmers can become interested and, at present there is hardly any activity of modern farming which will pay better than the maintenance and production of good poultry.
