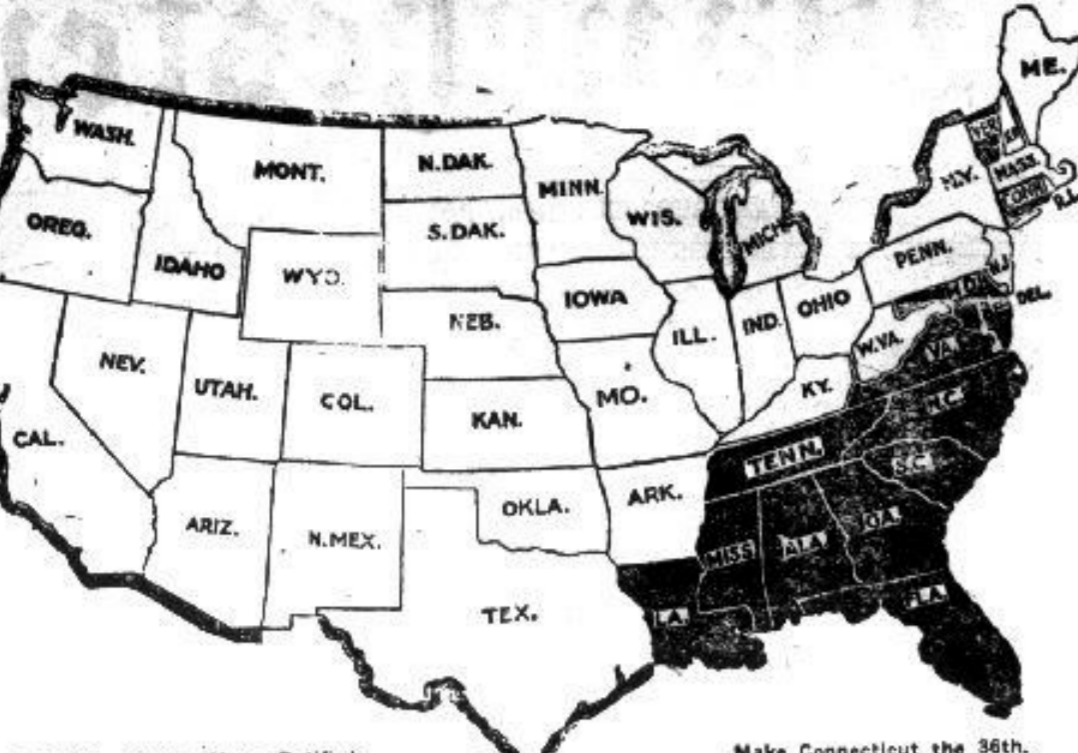

WHAT IS AN EMERGENCY? THE SPECIAL EMERGENCY DEMANDS SPECIAL SESSION OF LEGISLATURE

Say Women of Forty-Seven States, Coming From Every Corner of the United States, to Ask Suffrage Session of Connecticut.

Governor Robinson says that he will call a special session of the legislature to consider the federal suffrage amendment because an special emergency exists. The state constitution provides that in case of a special emergency the governor may convene the general assembly at any other than the regular time.

Francis W. Cole, a prominent Hartford lawyer, says concerning the governor's interpretation of "emergency": "An emergency is defined as an unforeseen occurrence or combination of circumstances which calls for immediate action."

The protest will cover the week of May 18, and will include a series of some thirty or forty meetings throughout the state which will be addressed by groups of the forty-seven women, who will spend the week in Connecticut as guests of the Connecticut Woman Suffrage Association.

CONNECTICUT WANTS SPECIAL SESSION

Thirty-five states have ratified the Federal Suffrage Amendment. Every northern state save Connecticut and Vermont has taken action. Connecticut legislators want to ratify.

His refusal is made in spite of the fact that a majority of both parties of both houses of the state legislature have petitioned the Governor to call a special session.

Resolved, by the Republicans of the state of Connecticut in convention assembled, that the convention places itself on record in favor of the granting of the right of suffrage to women, and the Governor of the state is respectfully requested to call a special session of the General Assembly for the purpose of passing upon the amendment to the Federal Constitution granting to women the right of suffrage.

START YOUR GARDEN EARLY

Department of Agriculture Puts Forth Plea for the Raising of More Food Products.

Gardens are going to be just as important the coming year as during the war period. United States department of agriculture specialists declare. High food costs, they say, are likely to remain until more to eat is grown and distributed. Farm gardens, village gardens and city backyard gardens all will help. Food produced in the garden not only helps balance the Texas budget but releases that grows on farms for the use of people who are entirely dependent upon others.

With the lengthening of the days it will not be long until land can be worked, and such hardy crops as peas, onions, lettuce, radishes and "beets" planted, especially throughout the lower Gulf coast region. The average date of the last killing frost of the winter in this section is not later than

Corner of a Town Garden. March 15. This zone includes the southern portion of South Carolina, the southern half of Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi, almost the whole of Louisiana and all southeastern Texas. Several of the more hardy garden crops, including those mentioned above, will withstand considerable frost and may be planted at least a month before the average date for the last frost. Irish potatoes are rarely injured by freezing, but they require about a month to come up and may be planted at about the same time as lettuce and radishes. It pays to take a chance on the early planting of certain of the more hardy garden vegetables. If they are killed or severely injured they may be replanted. A good method is to make about three plantings at intervals of three weeks, and if the first planting is killed the later ones take its place.

Panel for Spring Bedding. Pansy seed started in the conservatory or greenhouse now will make good plants for bedding out in the spring.

Sow the seeds in shallow pans or boxes and grow the plants in the sheltered and sunny place. Water them as they grow and take care to harden the plants off so they can be set out early in beds. The sashes must be taken off the cold frames early or the plants will become tall and spindly or "drawn," as the gardeners call them.
