> Canadian Labor Legislation. Extension of the industrial disputes act, through constitutional amendment, to include municipal employees in its 500 scope, is under discussion in Canada. The Montreal waterworks strike in 600 tensified sentiment in favor of widen ing the act. At present it does not

5.30 apply except to public utilities under ne provincial government. The Trades and Labor congress has gone on record as favoring amendments. This body of labor men opnosed the act and still stands on record against it, but the labor men agree largely that it has been useful in protecting workers as well as employers 125 and that it has a steadying influence on the Canadian industrial situation. 150 In 90 per cent of the industrial dis putes which have been referred to it the operation of the law has prevented strikes, according to the report of the deputy minister of labor, F. A. Acland. There have been 30 strikes in 400 disputes. About 100 disputes have been dealt with during the last year and at present seven boards are investigating 6,000 labor troubles in various parts of the

dominion. Canadian Labor Troubles. 150 The total number of strikes in Canada to 1918 was 196, involving 68,489 25 employees and a time loss of 763,341 working days. Comparative figures for 1917 are: Number of strikes, 148; employees involved, 48,329; time losses 1 134 970 working days. The class of industry most affected by strike was the metals, machinery and con-2,500 veyances group; the other industrial groups chiefly affected were mines, 4,075 smelters and quarries with 36 strikes, transportation with 16 strikes, and the 500 food group, where eight strikes were reported. It is stated that 30 per cent 2.800 of all strikes were due to demands for percented wages and 25 per cent to demands for increased wages and oth er changes. In 7 per cent of the cuses the dispute was due to the discharge 6.500 of employees. Of the total number of strikes 57.6 per cent were terminated .500 in favor of the employees and 20.9 per eent in favor of employers. In 10.7 300 per cent the disputes ended in a compromise and about the same percontage was indefinite or unterminated.




