Old St. John's chapel in Varick street, a landmark in downtown New York for more than a century, will soon give way to a mass of business and be replaced by a \$2,000,000 warehouse.

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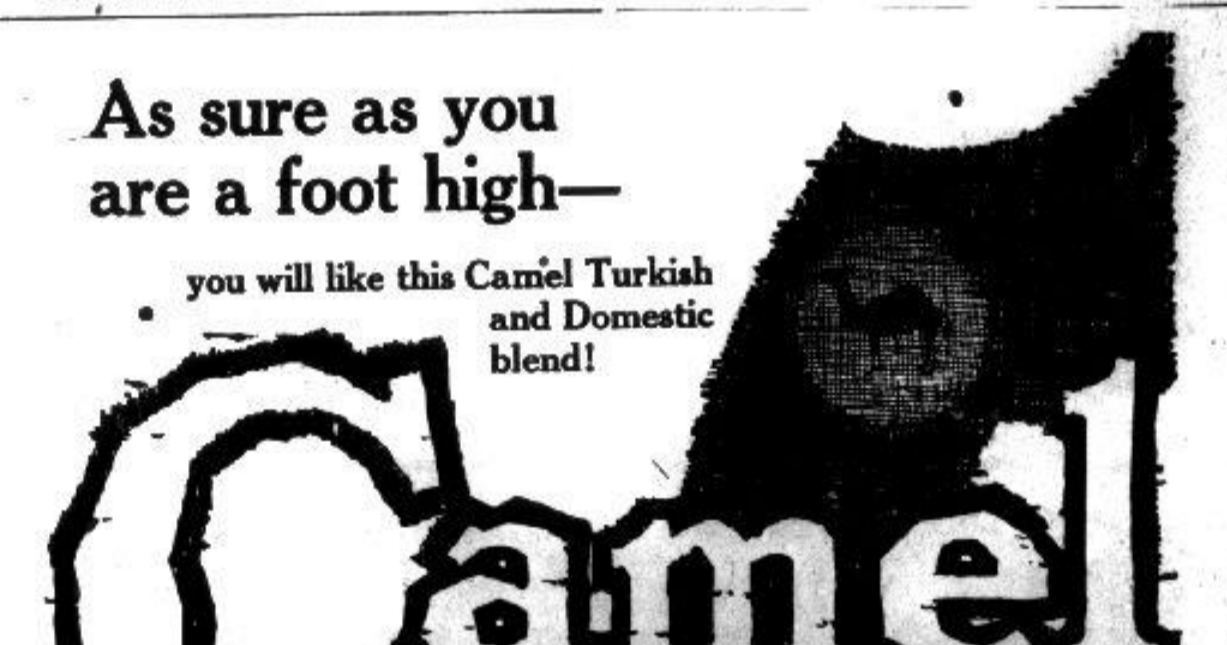
