Although Freud cites this as an example of his statement it will be noticed that the play upon words was Greek and not Oriental. Satyrs were of the male sex and had the horns, tall and legs of goats. They were mischievous creatures and sent the nightmare. To meet them or dream of them was accounted by the ancients as unfucky, in spite of the dream of Alexander. This would seem to ac count for the dictum of the modern mystics that to dream of a billygoat is unlucky, though to dream of killing one or seeing one killed is a favorable omen; the latter probably originating from the killing of a goat as a sin offering mentioned in Leviticus. 


