Where, then, did Shakespeare get the

The answer lies in the fact that "dollar" is an Anglo-Saxon corruption of the German "thaler," first coined about 1486 in the valley (or thaler) of Joachimsthal. The coin met with popular favor and, during the reign of Charles V, emperor of Germany, king of Spain and lord of Spanish-America, it became the standard currency of the world. Shakespeare merely adopted a slight change of the name, thus antedating both the United States and Great Britain -for the first and only English
