

It happened that a printer by the name of Catnach saw a chance to make a considerable sum of money through the publication of what he alleged to he the murderer's speech from the gallows. The paper containing this report sold fairly well, but the receipts did not a come up to Catanch's expectations. So he printed a second edition, with a headline in large letters across the top of the sheet: "WE ARE alive again!" These words actually appeared in Weare's speech, as reported, but the printer purposely left very little space between the first two words of the phrase and, reading the line "WEARE alive again!" thousands of persons bought the paper before they discovered the deception. The London Times referred to the matter as a "catchpenny,
