FOR "GPEEN SHOP" IN UTAH

Employing Job Printers Campaign Move Under the High-Sounding Name, "American Plan."

All the job printing shops in Salt Lake City and Ogden, Utah, will be conducted on the "American plan" (open shop) of employment after May 1, and a program will be inaugurated for collective dealing between management and employees, according to a statement issued by the executive committee of the employing printers. Sixteen shops in the two cities will be affected.

On March 11 the employers received formal notification from the Typographical union that, effective May 1, the union demanded a 48-hour week instead of the present 45-hour week and an increase of wages from \$30 to \$31 a week.

At Detroit resumption of full time operations by the Federal Motor Truck company was announced.

More than 10,000 steamers struck at Manila as a protest against a 20 per cent reduction in wages. Twenty-three factories were affected.

An order notifying employees of the Chicago Great Western shops of a lay-off April 2 was given out at Oshtemo, Wis.

Carpenters' Local No. 477, the largest union local in Omaha, voted to accept a 10 per cent wage reduction, effective April 1.

Fifteen hundred workers have been laid off through the closing of the Ford Tractor works, Cork, Ireland. It was stated that the plant might be sold to the British government.

Work was done at the Anaconda Copper Mining company's mines at Butte, Mont., stopped. Smelter operations will cease. It was stated that 1,000 men will be affected.

Calumet paperhangers, who had been on strike since March 1, returned to work at St. Louis, where their demand for a wage increase from \$1 to \$1.25 an hour was granted.

The Dool Packing company, Omaha, Neb., has cut pay 12 1/2 per cent for piece work and 8 cents an hour for hourly work, but retains the eight-hour day.

The Southern Pacific line's notice of a reduction in working force has been recalled and the present force of 24,000 men will continue at work. It has been officially announced.

Souvenirs varying from a chip off Eiffel tower to a German beer stein captured in Sedan were brought back from France by the returning American Legionnaires. But the most valuable of these souvenirs is a gold watch which was captured by a member of the Oregon Legion in the battle of Verdun. The watch is a gold watch with a dial set with diamonds and a case containing a small portrait of a woman. It is a very valuable relic of the war.

EX-SERVICE BOYS GET JOBS

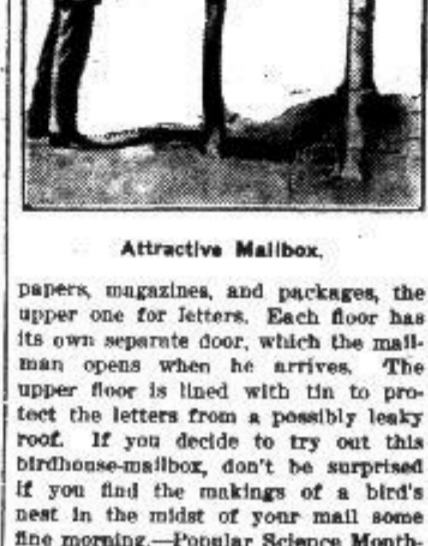
President of Chicago Grain Concern, Trench Experienced, Done Not Forget His Buddies.

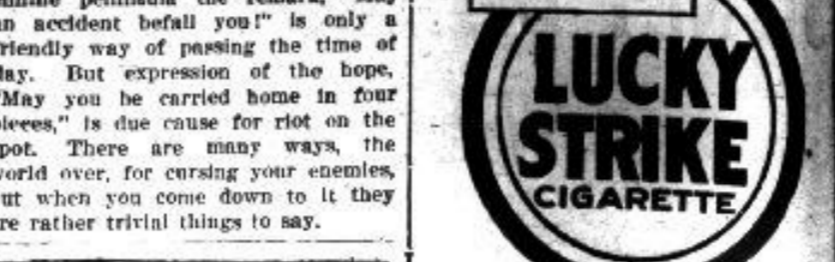
