RED CROSS GIVES ANNUAL BUDGET

\$19,361,657 Allotted for Current Program of Relief and Service.

MILLIONS FOR VETERAN AID

Medical Aid for European Children Will Cost \$6,000,000 This Year.

Washington.—Expenditures totaling \$19,361,657 for carrying through its program of relief and services in the United States and overseas are outlined in the budget of the American Red Cross for the current fiscal year.

Outstanding among the items of the domestic budget is the appropriation of \$3,988,256 for relief in behalf of the disabled ex-servicemen and their families.

Chief among the sub-divisions of the appropriation for work with veterans is that which concerns itself with assistance to disabled men and women in government hospitals.

Other items of the domestic budget include \$408,446 for miscellaneous activities, including contributions restricted for special purposes and \$708,000 for management.

From a fund of \$10,000,000, \$5,000,000 of which was contributed through the European Relief Council campaign and \$5,000,000 allotted by the Red Cross for child welfare work in Europe, there remains \$8,765,108 still available, of which it is estimated that \$2,000,000 will be required for work during the current year.

In supporting the national budget, the Red Cross implies it clear that the figures do not include chapter expenditures or place any cap estimate on the voluntary service of volunteers in chapters.

SEE EIGHT-HOUR DAY BREACHED

Railroad Workers Strong in Opposition to a Return to Ten Hours.

TOO MANY MEN UNEMPLOYED Pennsylvania Railroad's Refusal to Deal With the Brotherhoods is Decried—Attempt Will Be Made to Increase Union Membership.

Delegates representing more than 20,000 track and maintenance workmen in the New York District Council of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America...

Unorganized railway employees were called upon to affiliate with the union as soon as possible, "so that we may be able to resist any attempt on the part of the railroad companies to establish the ten-hour day collectively."

Since the Railway Labor board abolished the overtime rates above the eight-hour day, the men may, pending final disposition of the matter, many of the roads have taken advantage of the temporary decision to work their men longer hours...

The council opposes the wage reduction ordered by the board, holding that the railway worker cannot meet his necessary expenses with reduced wages.

The new minimum wage order of the Wisconsin Industrial commission which became effective August 1, is being generally acceptable to employers and employees alike as a fair compromise.

The new order leaves the rate of the old order in force, except for a reduction in the rate for the first three months of the learning period from 18 cents to 16 cents.
