



search for a mythical Fountain of Perpetual Youth that led Ponce de Leon, the Spanish explorer, to land near the present site of St. Augustine. His rediscovery of Florida in 1513 was on Easter Sunday hence the name, which is from Pascua Florida or Flowery Pasaover, which is the Spanish for Easter Sunday. The French were the next set-

tiers, founding a colony on the St. John's river. Spain promptly took action to maintain her ownership of this region and sent over an expedition which erected a fort under the leadership of Menendes at St. Augustine in 1565 and exterminated the Hugenot colony. St. Augustine is the oldest city in the United States. There followed a period of hostility between the English cologists in the Carolinas and the Spanish in Florida. By the treaty of 1768 Spain ceded Florida

to England in exchange for Havana, which England had captured a few years previous. remained an English colony until the last years of the Revolu-There were two provinces, Bast and West Florida. As the Spanish ruled Florida with a very loose form of government this region became the refuge of pirates, smuggiers and lawless characters. Such an element together with the unruly Seminole Indians naturally caused a great deal of trouble. To overcome this, President Monroe purchased Florida from Spain in 1819 for \$5,000,000 or about sieven cents an acre. It was

organized into a territory and in 1845 was admitted to the Unthe Evergiade State on account of the vast swamp-land in its southern part. It is also known as the Peninsula State and is the southernmost State of the Union. Its area is 58,660 square miles.
