WILL BUILD CONVENT ON PARK ST. FOR ST. JAMES CHURCH CORP.

Work was started Tuesday morning on a new convent to be built for the St. James Church Corporation on land just east of the home of Charles Worwick on Park street and a short distance west of the new school of the parish, which, when completed, will be occupied by the nuns who will teach in the new parochial school.

The plans are by Whitten & McMahon of Hartford and John Parrott, formerly a resident of South Manchester, but now located in Hartford, has been awarded the contract.

The building is to be of brick with limestone trimmings, a three-story structure with a gable roof. It will have a frontage of twenty-eight feet on Park street and will extend to the north a distance of ninety feet, which is more in depth than the present building. The frontage will be twenty-eight feet. The central portion of the building will be extended to the east and west so as to allow additional space for the school. This will be a two-story building and will provide for music rooms or reception rooms on the east side.

The front of the building will be used as a chapel and the altar will be located on the east side of this room. The entrance will be from the northeast corner. Within the entrance there will be a small hall. This will lead to the two music rooms on the right and will also connect with the main reception room to be located in the center. This will be the office of the mother superior.

The rear end of the building will be used for kitchen and dining room. The laundry will be located in the basement. Lightening will be by gas and electricity. The two upper floors will be reached by stairways at the rear.

On the second floor will be twelve sleeping rooms with individual lavatories. The baths will be located in the rear or north section.
