RUSSIA NEEDS VAST AMOUNT OF MACHINERY

Moscow—Russia needs a vast amount of machinery and other material for the upbuilding of her industries. Instead of a flood, the incoming streams of supplies are dry and hardly more than a trickle in the actual needs of the country. Had the Genoa conference agreed upon an international loan to help Russia's conditions in this regard might be much more favorable today, it is pointed out, but as it is, Soviet officials are saying: "A little water is welcome in a desert."

Ty to the present time the German Russian agreement signed at Genoa has not been followed by any great economic cooperation between the two countries, nevertheless German salesmen, German experts and German scouts for German capitalists are arriving in Moscow in constantly increasing numbers.
