CHIEF GORDON'S FIREWORKS EDICT PROVES BEST
(Continued from Page One)
The striking feature of the stock market last week was a steady decline in the volume of business transactions. This was caused partly by the holiday over Independence Day, and also to the public due to the irregularity of prices. The trading, however, was within very strict limits. The public is the main force behind the market in any general upswing. Statistics show that the volume of trading on the Exchange has been in effect since 1917 and it was drawn up at that time by Judge Alexander Arnett who was then town clerk. At that time all the powder industries of the country were busy turning out the elements of war to beat the Hun and it was an easy matter to regulate the discharge of fireworks on a national scale. However, since that time, the market has been in a state of fluctuation. The main question with relation to the present market is whether business and banking conditions are still improving. Certainly the purchasing power of the public has nowhere near been exhausted and there is a spirit of optimism. Wall Street expects a resumption of activity the latter part of the summer or early fall, and the statistics show that many lives perhaps have been spared and that many of the children have fingers and eyes that they might have lost had the celebration gone unrestricted for the past five years. Accidents have increased 50 percent, said Chief Gordon and judging from reports from local physicians the discharge of fireworks on the part of the public should be near 95 per cent.

The foreign situation remains dormant with the exception of Mexican handouts starting on another rampage. The negotiations of the oil companies with Adolfo de la Huerta may have to be abandoned finally because of serious difficulties in getting the Mexican government to agree on some technicalities. At all events the oil companies will undoubtedly make no heavy investments in Mexico until there has been a clarification of Article 27 of the Mexican Constitution, which holds that all mineral rights are the property of the Mexican Government. Due to mid-year demands for money in all sections of the country, New York funds became stringer and all loans went as high as 5 1/2 percent. A slackening was experienced early this week with anticipated easier rates in the near future. One thing plain about yesterday's market was the steady accumulation of good stocks. This has been in evidence since the beginning of the recent period of dullness. The effect of this accumulation should be felt shortly in sharper prices or perhaps in a steady holding up.
