In the first place, hogs need good succulent pasture as much of the time as possible, and in the second place they need protection against internal parasites, such as roundworms, the eggs of which remain in the soil. Pasturing can probably begin weeks after seeding, and may continue, if the rye is not covered with snow, until the following April.
