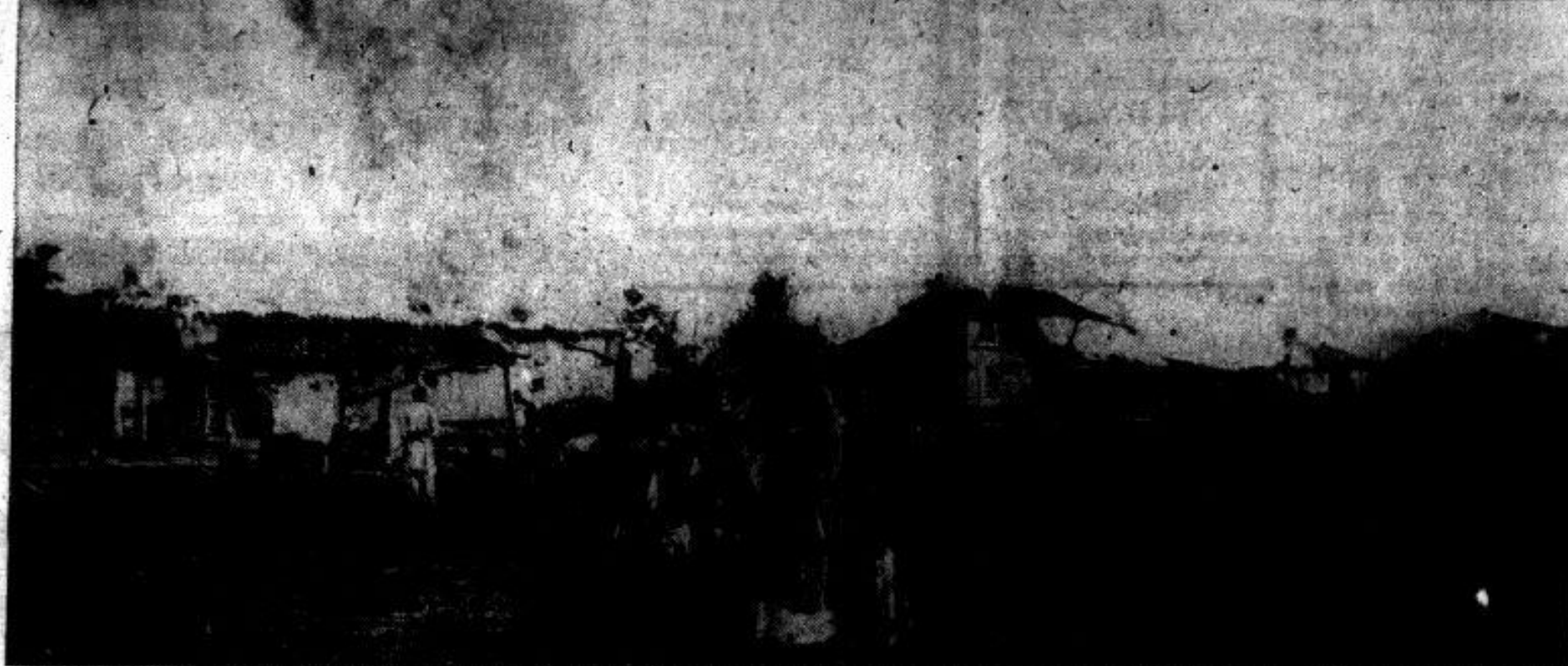

The Story of Ice Cream Manufacture In Manchester and Description of Equipment Turning Out Product Which Has State-Wide Reputation

GREAT oaks from little acorns grow is a trite and old expression. So old perhaps, that it might almost be described as a bromide. The difference in the size of the oak and acorn has never led anyone to doubt the truth of the above statement however. One does not have to draw on the imagination to accept it without questioning. But the jump from an unsatisfactory plate of ice cream to an ice cream plant the capacity of which exceeds 300 gallons of ice cream an hour is one that is apt to stagger the imagination. However, it is because the ice cream on the plate was unsatisfactory that the Manchester Dairy Company is now a fact. For if Patrick J. O'Leary had not decided in the summer of 1914 that he could make a better brand of ice cream than that which he was selling at his fountain this town would never have known perhaps, anything about the Manchester Dairy and its product for it is likely the plant would never have come into existence.

Having now seen the machinery that makes possible the harvesting and storing of the ice cream it would be well to start in at the mixing room where the cream is compounded, mixed and tested in order to be frozen.

The Mixing Room is one of the important adjuncts of the ice cream business because here the cream is taken from its outside dairies and compounded and mixed, the different flavors being added in the proper amount in order to be frozen to the proper consistency before harvesting.

There is a large condensing machine and two automatic refrigerating machines located in the power room. The condensing machine consists of 400 pounds of ammonia which is sent out under compression in a fine jet the size of a needle.

The cream mixer, the next step in the process is to freeze the cream that has been compounded with the proper flavor.

The four hardening rooms are capable of storing 3000 gallons of ice cream at any one time. But it might be said here that such an amount is rarely stored in the rooms because the trade demands keep making inroads on the storage of the plant.

There are two cream mixers in the mixing room, the glass-lined tanks of which are capable of mixing 400 gallons of cream each. On the inside of the tanks there are metal agitators located near the bottom of the tanks.
