MORGAN C. BULRELEY. FORMER UNITED STATES SENATOR. ENDS DISTINGUISHED CAREER. Attained Prominence in Many and Varied Fields of Activity as Statesman, Financier and Business Man—Had Extraordinary Executive Ability.

Ex-Governor Morgan C. Bulkeley, former United States Senator, died in Hartford on Wednesday, November 8, 1934, at his home, 157 E. 10th street, at the age of 87 years.

He was born in Brookfield, Conn., and began his business career in a mercantile house, staying in seven years from the grade of errand boy to partner. At the outbreak of the Civil War he enlisted in the Thirtieth New York Regiment and served eight months in the field.

Since 1878, Ex-Governor Bulkeley was president of the Hartford Fire & Marine Insurance Company (a term of 43 years), which placed him in the honored position of head of the greatest of the life insurance companies in this country.

Mr. Bulkeley was fortunate in both an ancestry. The founder of the Bulkeley family in this country was Peter Bulkeley, a fellow of St. John's College, Cambridge, England, who emigrated to Massachusetts in 1630.

It was in 1846 that Eliphalet A. Bulkeley became prominently identified with insurance by becoming first President of the Connecticut Mutual Life Insurance Company.
