### CONN. LEAGUE WOMEN VOTERS DISCUSS IMPORTANT QUESTIONS

Child Labor Law, Maternity-Infrancy Act—Various Phases Considered—Sugestions Offered

Bridgeport, Nov. 17.—That Connecticut is one of 13 states who child labor law measures up to the federal standard in every particular, and that it has made a marked reduction in its infant mortality during the past year, was the news that Miss Grace Abbott brought to the Connecticut League of Women Voters in its final annual session here last Thursday evening, Nov. 23.

Miss Abbott, who is chief of the federal children's bureau, was the speaker at a dinner given by the League, which was followed by an informal session at which Miss Ruth Morgan, Miss Mary Sheehans, and Mr. James G. McDonald spoke.

Regarding the future prospects of federal control of child labor since the decision of the Supreme Court in declaring the federal law null, Miss Abbott said, "Clearly we must either give up the plan of a federal law and rely solely upon the states, or we must have an amendment to the federal constitution definitely giving to Congress the power which the Supreme Court says it does not now have."

Senate Joint Resolution 232 proposes that Congress shall have the right to pass minimum standards for the protection of the working child. Most of the state enforcing officials, including those in Connecticut, will, I think, testify that instead of weakening respect for their state laws the federal child labor law resulted in increased respect for the state laws, and made it easier to raise state standards.

Miss Mary Sheehans, of Cambridgeport, who closed the evening session with a talk on "Women and the New Spirit in International Relations," said: "Leading women in Europe are feeling the call of a new spirit in international relations; this spirit is welcomed by the rank and file of women who have suffered from the effects of the war and are still suffering from the peace settlements."
