world war. "There is some question as to whether it is not already too late to salvage the wrecks left by the war. We went into the war at the tail end: we virtually dictated the terms of the peace and then we went home. We quit. That is the first thing that is wrong with the international situation. The other important fact is that we cannot stay out of European affairs if we want to. We will again be drawn in and the only question is whether we go in too late or go in now."
