Provision will be made for the office of the Child Welfare Nurse. The upper part of the house will be used for lodging quarters for the employees at the Memorial Hospital. The trustees have purchased additional land from the Thibodeau estate adjacent to the present hospital property extending east on Haynes street 200 feet and being of the same depth as the property owned by the hospital.

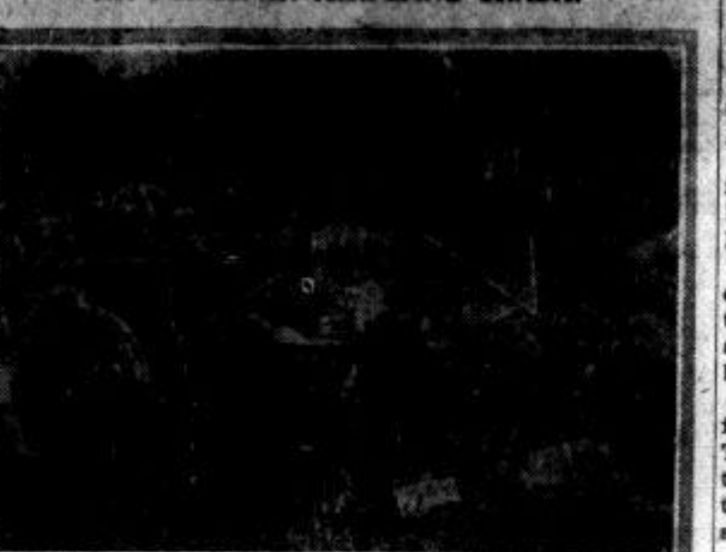
