### VOTERS FAVOR DRY BROOK REMOVAL

#### HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES PASSED BILL YESTERDAY FOR RAISE OF COURT OFFICIALS PAY

Smith of Manchester providing for a raise in the salaries of the officials of the town court of Manchester yesterday passed the House of Representatives at Hartford and was forwarded to the Senate under a suspension of the rule. However when the bill reached the Senate it was held up with several others by Senator John N. Brooks who said that he was opposed to a suspension of the rule unless good reason could be shown. The Senate therefore tabled action on these bills and they will come up in their regular course on the calendar.

#### Appropriate \$30000 to Put Storm Water Menace Underground—Approve Lighting Contract.
