

CHIEF "CURLEY" SURVIVOR OF CUSTER MASSACRE, DEAD

Remains of Scout Had Recently Received \$100,000 Back Money Due Him From Government.

Hartford, May 24.—Chief "Curley," famed Indian Scout who died here today, was the only survivor when he died. General Custer's command, massacred on the Little Big Horn, June 25, 1876. Recently a moving picture company has been making arrangements to feature Chief "Curley" on the screen. When a camera man for a moving picture camera arrived at the home of Chief "Curley" known in the Crow Indian tongue as Chief Shoshone, to film the aged scout for the movie, he found the revered leader of the tribe wrapped in a blanket, lying on the wet ground in the rain. It developed that the chief was ill, had a high fever, and that his method of obtaining relief was to lie in the rain. Chief "Curley" was a unique figure in the West. He was a leader of one of the most progressive Indian tribes in the nation. He taught the fact to be taught to primitive methods of treating human ailments. He was a splendid fighter, and his fighting record was more than 4000. He was a straight as an arrow. Until a fortnight ago he was in splendid physical condition, but since having been taken ill he has lost 15 pounds. He was 67 years of age. Chief "Curley" was the only survivor of General George Armstrong Custer's command, massacred on the Little Big Horn, in southeastern Montana, 47 years ago next June 25. Last month he received a back pension of \$100 a month for 47 years. The pension was given him through the Department of the Interior.

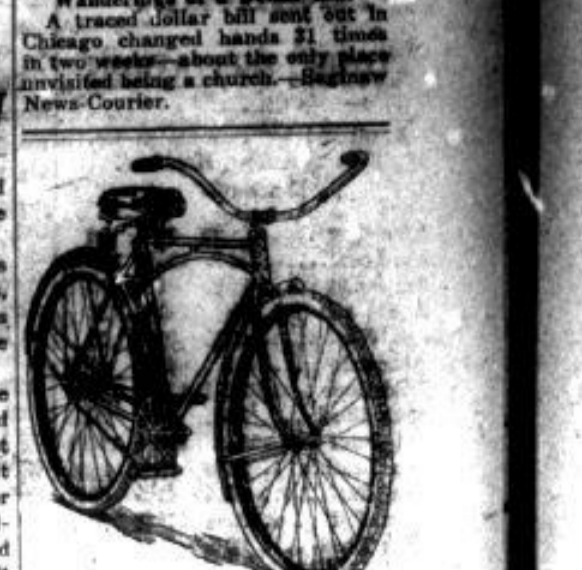
