There is a smooth, fine cement-tile floor which is hygenic and easily cared for. This should be rounded to the walls, leaving no cracks and corners to collect dust and dirt. Hard wood floors serve for most of us. and with a solid, impervious finish, and washable rugs, are very satisfactory. If as is sometimes the case, a hard wood floor is not attainable, linoleum is an excellent substitute, and there are patterns almost exactly resembling hard wood. It should be cemented down, the edges protected by a small rounded moulding. As to rugs, fairly heavy ones should be purchased; there is nothing that gives a bathroom a more untidy look than disarranged, kicked-up rugs. The heavy ones, which may be woven to order in exact sizes required, are no more expensive in the long run than the cheap thin ones,

Glass shelves are excellent, ornamental, and attainable. The tub, if we are at the beginning of things is best set directly on the floor—in the interest of cleanliness. It is however, perfectly possible to keep the floor underneath a tub standing on feet dustless, with the aid of indispensable dry




