Davis Plans Compulsory Alien Registration In U.S.

Labor Secretary Claims 7,000,000 Undesirables Are Now in Country—Will Tour Country Speaking For Plan to Curb "Alien Bootleggers."

Washington, June 18.—A proposal for the elimination of undesirable aliens from the United States through the compulsory "enrollment" of all aliens, will be carried to the American people for approval this fall by Secretary of Labor James T. Davis, he told International News Service today.

The Secretary proposes a system of registration by which every alien in the country would be kept on the rolls and in the hands of a national law enforcement officer. The plan would enable the government to sift them for undesirable. Those found to be undesirable would be given fair deportation trials. The nation would then be rid of them. It is the plan to keep on the rolls all those who were admitted to the United States on a national law enforcement officer's list.

The plan would also permit the government to select the type of immigrants to be admitted to the United States. It would be possible to refuse admission to those who were not believed in by the government. With this enrollment system in operation we could build up the best of American citizenship.

The Secretary's plan will start in the fall. He will be in the States in late September or early October.

Barbot and His Flyover Plane

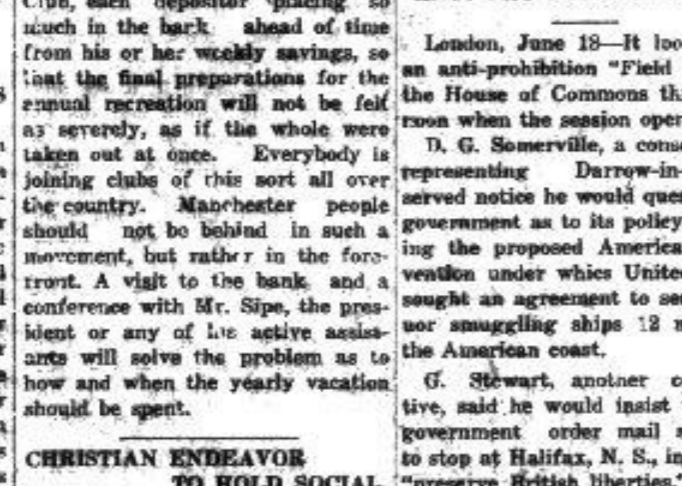
