San Francisco, July 6.—The saving of \$1,000,000 or more a year by California shippers is the aim of the California State Railroads Committee, which has adopted a nationally significant temporary express rate case.

Refusal of the Commission to make the 1.2 per cent express rate increase now in effect has been asked by the State that since the staticians of the Commission rejected

the Interstate Commerce Commission at Washington.

Not only is a greater saving to California producers that should be shipped by express being diverted to freight lines, but certain California industries find it impossible to compete with their products in the market because of the high express rates.

Gordon prepared this brief not only for the California Railroad Commission, but as chief counsel for the Interstate Commerce Commission with California in asking the Interstate Commerce Commission to lower express rates, or at least not increase the rates.

At present, the greatest saving to California producers is in the cotton, which comprises the fifth zone of the five zones into which the country is divided in the fixing of express rates, and certain California industries find it impossible to compete with their products in the market because of the high express rates.

The brief declares that the present rates are retained by the Interstate Commerce Commission it will result in a revenue to the express companies more than a fair return on their investment, paying adequate compensation to the railroad for the express privilege.

SPANISH PREMIER REMOVES AGUILERA

London, July 6.—The Spanish Premier today ordered Gen. Aguilera, minister of war, to resign. The Spanish War Council, according to despatches from Madrid, The action followed a clash in the Senate last night when Aguilera demanded the government to remove him and criticized it for "treacherously to prosecute those who have failed in their duty."

Rumors of a coup by the Aguilera forces had been spreading about the Spanish capital, so when Aguilera's removal, declared that threats made against the government could be carried out only over the dead bodies of the members of the Cabinet."

Madrid, July 6.—Gen. Aguilera, military leader, told today as the Spanish Mussolini as rumors filled the city that a Fascist coup was imminent.

The air is full of political agitation and the military party has spread propaganda against the government throughout Spain.

Aims of the Aguilera forces, which are believed to have the support of the army, are to crush the Socialist party, which they believed responsible for the Moroccon disasters.

Aguilera accuses the government of lack of energy in prosecuting them but failed in their duty.

It is believed that the government will dare not fight him for his attacks upon politicians. Aguilera is reported to have warned his military leaders he would sweep them from a dual.

During the Senate session last night Aguilera clashed with Senor Gómez, Conservative leader, and challenged him to a duel.

Gómez declined the invitation, saying it would be an "assault."
