HOT SPRINGS

NATIONAL PARK
The Hot Springs National Park, in the mountains of Arkansas, is one of the most popular of our national health resorts, having over 100,000 people each year. Not all visitors are in search of pleasure, some are in search of pleasure, but what or the rest are there? For instance, all are attracted by the famous hot springs. The hot water of the springs was used by the Indians before America was discovered, and was a water cure for rheumatism early as the sixteenth century, when according to the legend, the springs were visited by the Indians to treat their sprains.

The first springs, as well as the other resources and the geology of the park and the adjacent country, are described in the Hot Springs geological (Mo.) which was issued by the Director of the Interior. This folio, which is illustrated with maps and views, may be purchased for twenty-five cents from the Director of the Geological Survey at Washington, D. C.

STATE RELOCATING

MILK STATIONS
Several of the milk stations on public highways are located as to cause traffic hazards is the object of a plan which the state board of agriculture is co-operating with the department of transportation to implement. The Union forces were repulsed with disastrous results.

It is being adopted that the state is adopting a policy requiring that they be set back a safe distance from the highways, like roadside stations in front of them will not obstruct any portion of the highway.

A meeting of the state board of agriculture was held July 22d, at which time information was received from the commissioner of motor vehicles that complaints were coming from various parts of the state relative to a traffic hazard.

Milk stations have been erected so close to the roadway that the vehicles collecting the milk stand partially across the edge of the highway when loading. This not only results in delay, but is liable to cause accidents as well.

In view of the lack of information it was voted that the secretary be instructed to inform those interested and suggest that steps be taken to obtain the difficulty before action is taken, and that these by those having authority in such matters.

The motor vehicle department has found that several states and cities have taken the edge of the highway are situated near curves in the road that motor vehicles coming around the bend, while milk was being loaded, would have to stop quickly, particularly if a third car was approaching in the opposite direction.
