The spring season for forest fires in Connecticut seems to be finished although bad fires are raging in Colorado and the Lake States. The fires started by lightning which has been blown over New England intermittently for the past fortnight. In this state 480 fires have been reported which is about half the number reported for the spring season last year.

Fire wardens are enthusiastic over the pumps sent out by the state forest service and by units there. In some cases they have been entirely reduced the damage done by the fires. The average area burned per fire this season was 25 acres as against 79 last year.
