President Expresses Pleasure At Reports That Threatened Tie-Up On September 1 Is Averted—Miners Drop "Check-Off" Demands In Return For Similar Concessions From Operators—Atlantic City Conference Resumed Today

Washington, Aug. 16.—President Coolidge is extremely pleased at the progress of the conference between the United States Coal Commission and anthracite operators and miners in New York, called at the White House last night.

From reports he has received, the President is advised that the threatened hard coal tie-up will be averted, and that the contending factions soon will be able to resume negotiations and work out a new and satisfactory wage contract to replace the one expiring September first.

The miners, at their conference, are the more pleased for a wage with the commission, and the operators are pleased to have secured the "check-off" of the operators.

These reports are being received by the President from the Atlantic City conference, which is being held at the Hotel Hamilton.

It is expected that the conference will be able to reach a final agreement by the end of the month.
