South Manchester Water Company Announces Acquisition of 5 Square Miles of Water Shed in East Glastonbury—New Reservoir to Be Built—Will Increase Investment Double its Present Value—Higher Water Rates for Domestic and Hydrant Service Necessary.

The South Manchester Water Company has announced that it has recently completed a series of transactions whereby it has acquired rights to allow the diversion of water from what is known as Hoar Brook water shed, comprising practically all of the land north of Glastonbury, in East Glastonbury, with an area of about 5 1/2 square miles. When this is provided with the necessary storage reservoirs it will give a maximum weekly flow of about 20,000,000 gallons, which is about four times the present supply.

Expensive Proposition

The proposition has been an expensive proposition and as the company has not been receiving sufficient revenue, either from domestic or hydrant service, it is not likely that the water rates in South Manchester, affecting both services will have to be raised. Just what the amount of this rate will be, the water company is not prepared to say.
