COOLIDGE DUE FOR DISAPPOINTMENT IN ATTEMPT TO FLOOD COUNTRY WITH SUBSTITUTES FOR HARD COAL

President Marks of Bituminous Union—Lewis Denies Threats of Sympathy Strike—Both Sides Mark Time in Atlantic City.

Atlantic City, N. J., Aug. 23.—Miners of the soft coal fields of Pennsylvania today pledged their loyalty to the hard coal miners in the event the latter go out on strike September first.

James Marks, vice-president of the Central Pennsylvania Bituminous Coal District, accompanied by five aides, arrived here this morning and held an extended conference with J. L. Lewis, president of the United Mine Workers of America.

Marks, it was learned, told Lewis that "President Coolidge had refused to grant the miners' demands for a 10 per cent increase in wages and a 40-hour week."

"I thought the bituminous miners of the Pennsylvania field would not be flooding the country with fuel substitutes in the event of a strike in the anthracite district," Marks said.

"The soft coal miners are here on a matter of internal policy," Lewis said.

Lewis denied the bituminous miners would stage a strike in sympathy with the hard coal miners.

"The bituminous miners have an iron bound contract and the United Mine Workers will not break it," Lewis said.
