AMERICA ON ROAD TO "GOOD TIMES"

Federal Reserve Board Finds Continued Improvement in Trade. Washington, Aug. 28.—Industrial activity is well on its way to "good times," the Federal Reserve Board indicates today in a general review of business conditions.

Although seasonal declines in employment were reported, the board also announced numerous wage advances. A synopsis of the report follows: Production in basic industries declined one per cent in July following a partial recovery in June.

Wholesale commodity prices declined the period, at the end of July reaching a point five per cent below the April peak. Prices of a group of commodities were lower than at any other time during the current year.
