Italy's Move Threatens World Peace

Another European War Seems Certain to Engulf Nations... 'Where Will it All End?' Universal Query—British Press Alarmed and Points Out That General Situation is Comparable to 1914—Balkan Ureast Never So Alarming—League of Nations is Only Hope for Peace

London, Sept. 1.—All Europe trembled today over Italian hostilities against Greece, fearing a new Balkan war. It was a Balkan dilemma which brought on the world war.

British newspapers expressed the utmost fear. A great question mark spread over all Europe with the universal query: "Where will it all end?"

A dispatch from Athens, quoted Premier Gladstone as saying that the dispute with Italy over the killing of Italian on the Albanian border had been referred to the League of Nations.

The Italian seized Corfu. Greek officers were seized and taken aboard an Italian warship.

England and France are anxious to Italy's war aims. Mussolini of Italy is accused of violating Article 12 of the League of Nations.

The miners' reply to the operators' plan of settlement was termed a "friendly rejection."
