

BRITISH TURN DOWN 12 MILE LIMIT FOR COAST GUARD

STATE DEPARTMENT ADVISED HUGHES NOTE IS CONSIDERED UNSATISFACTORY TO BRITAIN

Refusal is Softened by Promise of His Majesty's Government to Submit Question to Imperial Conference—No Hope Looked for From This Direction—Extension Would Aid Coast Guard Fleets in Curbing Run Runners.

Washington, Sept. 19.—Great Britain has virtually turned down the proposal recently made by the American Government to extend the legal limit of searching ships at sea to twelve miles. Announcement in this effect was made at the State Department this morning.

The position of the British government was outlined in a note received at the State Department in London, Sept. 17. It was in response to a communication from the American government recently handed to the British government by Secretary of State Hughes in which he proposed the reciprocal right of seizure and search for twelve miles instead of the customary three miles.

Little Hope. In view of the attitude of London however, this submission of the proposal to the Imperial Conference in London open at Washington as having fair little hope that there will be any change in the present three mile limit.
